How Do I Find Out What is Going On with NCYC?

All of our communication is done primarily through e-mail and handouts. Our weekly newsletter – NORTHWEST NOTES – always has important information regarding upcoming rehearsals and performances as well as any scheduling and calendar updates and announcements from the directors and NCMA staff. Please open and read these weekly. Our calendar online uses Google Calendar (which can be linked to Outlook) and the NCMA calendar can be checked at any time.

Any handouts received at rehearsals can always be found on our website in the NCYC member downloads section. E-mails from ncmusica.org will always keep your e-mail address confidential. We do not publish or share e-mail addresses. If your family does not have e-mail or if your e-

mail/computer is not working, please make sure we know this so that we can have a copy of all our communications available with your name on it at the check-in desk at each rehearsal.

NCMA and NCYC use Patron Mail which is a company that provides e-mailing tools to not-for-profit and for-profit arts corporations. It is fully compliant with all current security laws and CAN SPAM legislation which just means that it is the safest way for us to e-mail you. If at any time you stop receiving e-mail from us please notify us immediately. If you change your e-mail address, please let us know as soon as possible.

What will I learn in NCYC?

Music which is:

- ❖ Age appropriate and of excellent quality
- ❖ Fun, challenging and invites learning
- ❖ From many cultures and traditions
- ❖ Grounded with excellent texts, sometimes in foreign languages

In Aria Choir, I will have the opportunity to learn:

- ✓ Basic sight reading skills using solfège to identify and read patterns
- ✓ Basic rhythm reading skills using counting system
- ✓ Foundation skills of singing incorporating body, mind, and voice concepts
- ✓ Beginning music theory through class work
- ✓ Basic performance and audience etiquette

In Bella Voce Choir, I will have the opportunity to learn:

- ✓ Advanced beginning sight reading skills
- ✓ Intermediate rhythm reading skills using more complex rhythms and time signatures, with counting system
- ✓ Foundation skills of singing incorporating body, mind, and voice concepts
- ✓ Advanced beginning music theory through class work
- ✓ More complex music, with up to two-part harmony

In Cantabile Choir, I will have the opportunity to learn:

- ✓ Intermediate to advanced sight reading skills
- ✓ Intermediate to advanced rhythm reading skills using complex rhythms and time signatures, with counting system
- ✓ Advanced singing skills with complex, challenging music

- ✓ Intermediate music theory through class work

In Di Canto Choir, I will have the opportunity to learn:

- ✓ Intermediate to advanced sight reading skills and applied music theory
- ✓ Intermediate to advanced rhythm reading skills using complex rhythms and time signatures, with counting system
- ✓ Advanced singing skills with complex, challenging music

What happens at rehearsals?

In Aria Choir, I will have the following basic schedule:

- ✓ Arrive at 5:50 pm
- ✓ Sign-in (use the bathroom, get a drink)
- ✓ Organize music in order from list on the board
- ✓ Warm-ups begin promptly at 6:00
- ✓ Work on music for concerts, Rhythm activities, Sight reading activities, Theory lesson, Game songs or games with concepts learned

In Bella Voce Choir, I will have the following basic schedule:

- ✓ Arrive at 5:50 pm
- ✓ Sign-in (use the bathroom, get a drink)
- ✓ Organize music in order from list on the board
- ✓ Warm-ups begin promptly at 6:00
- ✓ Work on music for concerts, in large groups and sectionals, Sight reading activities, Theory lesson

In Cantabile Choir, I will have the following basic schedule:

- ✓ Arrive at 7:20 pm
- ✓ Sign-in (use the bathroom, get a drink)
- ✓ Warm-ups begin promptly at 7:30
- ✓ Work on music for concerts, in large groups and sectionals, Sight reading, Theory lesson

In Di Canto Choir, I will have the following basic schedule:

- ✓ Arrive at 7:20 pm
- ✓ Sign-in (use the bathroom, get a drink)
- ✓ Warm-ups begin promptly at 7:30
- ✓ Work on music for concerts, in large groups and sectionals, Sight reading

What if I am sick or have to miss a rehearsal?

Throughout the course of the year, many students will never miss a rehearsal while others will have to miss due to illness, family conflicts, music concerts, or school required events. These types of absences are unavoidable but should be communicated to us well in advance of the conflict.

In order to help us keep track of attendance, we ask that:

- 👉 You sign-in at all rehearsals.
- 👉 You e-mail your excused absence in advance. There is a form on the website which you can fill out, or you can email attendance@ncmusica.org.
- 👉 If you are sick with a fever or are contagious and will not be able to sit in your rehearsal to observe
 - Call as soon as you can: 815.356.SING (7464)

No one will be asked to leave the choir because of his/her absences; however, more than 2 absences will affect the degree to which you might participate in a concert or activity. If you have missed excessive rehearsals, your conductor will make the final decision on an individual case basis, with regards to your participation in concerts and tours.

What should I bring to rehearsals?

All students must bring the following to every rehearsal – even if you have the music memorized!

1. Pencil (sharpened!)
2. Music (all of it, in the bag)
3. WATER BOTTLE (closeable so it will not spill)

What is Music Theory?

Music theory is much like spelling and grammar for any reader or writer. It is the study of the basic concepts of music through written and aural examples. Each week students in Aria, Bella Voce and Cantabile will work on a section of the theory “bluebook” during rehearsal. Your theory work will be left each week so your director can see how you’re doing. In Di Canto, the study of theory concepts is integrated with sight reading work. This work will be directly related to the music being prepared for concerts.

How do I receive and return my music?

Music is handed out at the beginning of the year. Every student is assigned a number: A-15 is Aria #15, B-20 is Bella Voce #20, etc. When you receive your music, you will sign an inventory sheet which serves as your agreement to return all music in excellent condition. You should store your music in the bag provided. Theory workbooks will remain at rehearsals.

At the end of the year, the music will be returned during placement interviews. All music will be handed in and checked against your inventory sheet. Any student missing music or turning in music that is in unusable condition will be charged \$3.50 per copy. Sight reading books and zipper bags are \$10.00 each.

What is Retreat?

In September, all NCYC choirs participate in a retreat. It is a required event for all singers unless special permission is given by the director. The purpose of the retreat is to give students an opportunity to meet each other through singing, games and free time (which isn't always available during our limited regular rehearsal schedule), as well as a chance to get to know the conductor and accompanist. For the conductors, they relish the extra time to work on team building and the chance to build rapport and a sense of community within each choir and between the choirs. The choirs also spend considerable time working on their music for the year. This year, Cantabile and Di Canto will be doing an overnight retreat to a waterpark in Lake Geneva. Aria and Bella Voce will be doing their retreat during the day at our rehearsal location of First Congregational Church and then having pizza and swimming in the evening.

What is the School Tour?

Aria, Bella Voce and Cantabile choirs take a bus tour on a school day to four or five local schools in McHenry County to sing for their students. On a given school tour NCYC may perform for over 3500 students. Not only is school tour a lot of fun, but it serves several important purposes. It exposes many children to choral music who may not have any experience listening to a choir and it gives each child an opportunity to see the potential for musical excellence by children. Our students benefit from increased opportunities to perform their literature outside of our spring concert and their performance might inspire another child to seek out music in their own lives, perhaps even becoming part of our choir.

What are Placement Interviews?

Placement Interviews occur at the end of the year for all students (see calendar). The directors will spend time listening to your child sing, sight read and talk about their choir experience and progress. If your child is at a point where they might be old enough and ready move to the next level choir, both directors will be present (current and future) to make the decision. A progress report is sent home for each student and parent and student evaluations are completed at this time. All students complete a placement interview regardless of age or intention to join next year. If continuing, the next year's registration form and non-refundable deposit is due at this time.

How do I get tickets for the concerts?

Tickets may be purchased at rehearsals, by phone, or fax. A credit card is required for all fax and phone orders. Individual tickets will be sold at the door; season tickets must be purchased in advance of first concert. Ticket order forms will be available at all rehearsals and online at www.ncmusica.org.

*Cantabile and Di Canto Girls: Concert dresses are handed out at rehearsals beginning in October. If you miss a fitting, please call the office. Remember that you may need to have your dress hemmed so be sure to try it on with your flat dress shoes at home. All dresses must be returned washed and in good condition at placement interviews; **a \$90 fee will be assessed for missing or damaged dresses.** For care instructions, please refer to the paper enclosed with your dress.

What is the Cabaret and Silent Auction?

Cabaret Night is a concert and NCMA's one of three major fundraisers of the year. Ticket sales and Silent Auction proceeds generate funds to offset costs for all participants in all programs. Please consider volunteering to help with this annual event – it is always a terrific evening! See page 8 for ticket information.

Here are some ways parents can help us with the Cabaret and Silent Auction:

- Finding businesses and individuals who would like to donate items or services to the Silent Auction.
- Serving on the Cabaret or Silent Auction committee
- Attending the event
- Invite friends, family, neighbors and co-workers to the event and encourage them to participate in the Silent Auction.
- Sponsor a group of tickets and give away to people you think might enjoy supporting NCMA and NCYC

Do you have fundraisers?

Yes! Because we are a not-for-profit corporation, our funding comes from a variety of resources. Individual donations cover nearly 15% of our costs, corporate donations and grants about 10%. Tuition and ticket income covers approximately 75% of our operating costs and does not include any Encore Choir tour costs. In other words, without fundraising we would need to charge at least 25% more in tuition rates to cover our operating costs.

NCMA uses the Silent Auction as well as the business program advertising funds and the annual campaign as its three main public fundraisers. These opportunities raise money for the NCMA Annual Fund which offsets costs for everyone in all programs.

Fundraising opportunities planned for 2010-2011:

- ☞ Annual Campaign: Individual Donations towards NCMA's Annual Fund.
- ☞ Program Advertising: Individuals and businesses purchase advertising space in our program booklets.
- ☞ Cabaret and Silent Auction: Ticket sales will cover the cost of the event any remaining proceeds will go to support NCMA's programs. All proceeds from the Silent Auction will go into NCMA's Annual Fund.
- ☞ Other Fundraisers, such as raffles, coffee or cheesecake sales, are optional and will be offered as needed to help raise funds for specific events or purchases made by the organization.

What is the Encore Choir?

Encore Choir is a touring choir consisting of students in Cantabile and Di Canto who choose to participate. All students participating in Encore Choir will indicate their intention to participate at the beginning of the year. The cost of Encore Choir varies, and includes the cost of the trip scheduled for that year. (Payments begin up to a year in advance of the trip.) A limited amount of financial aid is available to students who qualify.

The long-range plan for Encore is to go on trips which are higher cost one year and lower cost the following year. A student could potentially participate in Encore Choir from 6th grade through senior year of high school. Trips may be cancelled if a minimum enrollment is not reached.

How can parents help the choir in other ways?

We are so grateful for every bit of your support, both financial and otherwise, as well as your commitment to your child’s music education. We will contact you regarding how you might help out, according to your indications on the NCYC Volunteer Form.
